Newly Appointed Citizenship SG

Acting Prime Minister Meets Public Service Commission on Performance Reforms

The Acting Prime Minister and Minister of Finance and Economic Management, Hon. Johnny Koanapo Nies Rasou, this morning received the Chairman of the Public Service Commission (PSC), Mr. Meto Nganga, and the Acting Secretary of the Commission, Mr. Jean-Yves Bibi, at his office for discussions on public service performance and the implementation of government policies.

Discussions focused on the critical role of public servants in translating government policies and directives into tangible benefits for the people of Vanuatu.

The Acting Prime Minister expressed concern that the implementation of several government policies has been delayed or constrained, noting that public servants serve as a vital conduit between the Government and citizens who rely on effective service delivery.



In response, the Chairman and Acting Secretary of the PSC acknowledged these concerns and briefed the Acting Prime Minister on significant and innovative reforms recently undertaken by the Commission to strengthen performance management across the public service.
